Dear Friends,

I write on behalf of the Circuit Staff Team. At our last meeting we agreed it would be helpful to set out something of the process for recruiting new members of staff for next September, and to encourage each other to be prayerful and hopeful as we look to the future.

Next year will be, of course, a period of considerable change in ministry within the Circuit. However, we can look forward with continuing confidence not least because we have a great team in place already for 1st September 2017. Offering presbyteral ministry will be the Revds Elizabeth Cushion, Rory Dalgleish, Ian Hill, Andy Lindley, John Schofield and Julia Skitt. Our Circuit Lay Staff includes Lois Cross (Circuit Support Manager), Angie Creswick (Circuit Resources Manager), Kim Gabbatiss (Children's and Family Worker) and Victoria Etherington (Youth Ministry Leader.)

Profiles for both a new Superintendent (and with pastoral charge of Huntington, Strensall and Thornton Le Clay) and an ordained Presbyter (with pastoral charge of Haxby & Wigginton and New Earswick) are part of the Connexional Matching process which is now underway. We may receive a match for one or both of these appointments in early November. If not, there should be news either in December or January.

Our application for a new Probationer Presbyter (for Heworth, Dunnington and Stamford Bridge) has been accepted and we anticipate that someone will be appointed in January.

Our application for a City Centre Deacon has also been accepted and we anticipate that someone will be appointed in December or January.

Circuit Council also agreed to the appointment of two lay pastoral roles to further strengthen the team. The details of these proposals for these positions will be worked out in the next few months.



As we work through this year to put in place the team from September 2017 it is equally important that we continue to focus on pursuing our Cir-cuit's Vision.

We hope and pray that this will be a year when together we continue to "**Grow in Christ**" through our life of worship, learning & caring, service and evangelism. We will continue to seek to embody our Vision's principles of: Inspiring Ministry, Developing our Gifts, Witnessing in the World, Offering Hospitality, Valuing Diversity and Nurturing Relationships.

Through the work of the Vision Coordinating Team the Circuit Council has agreed that we will be in better shape to fulfil our Vision when we are able to:

- Release people from some of the burdens of governance and property management. We are delighted to have Angie Creswick on our team to help us take steps forward in this area.
- Strengthen small groups, where people can grow in faith, and be encouraged in the use of their gifts. We are exploring initiatives to help us move forward in this area and will be sharing more shortly.
- Develop lay leadership, rediscovering an important part of our Methodist heritage. We will continue to explore how we can be a part of wider current developments within Methodism to help encourage lay leadership.

So, as a Staff Team may we encourage you to be prayerful and hopeful as we look ahead. In particular, we would appreciate your prayers for:

- The Connexional Stationing Matching Group and other groups with responsibility for matching ministers to the roles we are seeking;
- Our Circuit Stewards as they undertake much planning and other work;
- The Circuit Council as it seeks to make wise decisions as Trustees of the Circuit;
- The Staff Team as they continue to offer spiritual leadership through this year;
- The life of the whole Circuit as together we pursue **Our Calling** to be a people **Growing in Christ**.

Youth Ministry Leader: Victoria Etherington

Since starting work as Circuit Youth Ministry Leader on October 1^{st} life has been very hectic! I moved back to England from the US with my husband and our teenage daughters in July. Whilst



in the US I worked as a youth minister and ministry consultant and went back into education completing a Masters of Divinity and a Masters in youth ministry. This represented a continuation and development of the work I had done in England before our move.

As the role of youth ministry leader is a new role in a large circuit, one of the first challenges is to work out what the immediate priorities should be. York Circuit already has some high quality youth work and one of the first tasks is to support this, especially at Haxby and Wigginton, as Karen Turner prepares for her move in December. In order to become more familiar with the circuit and the existing youth work, I will be visiting as many churches as possible. The purpose of this is the creation of an accurate map of the existing youth work in the circuit. Supporting and celebrating the everyday heroes who work faithfully with young people and creating a network between them are also early priorities. Developing a picture of the current youth work and linking people who deliver it makes it possible for us to work together and identify areas of possible future development.

In addition to the circuit responsibilities the role includes an element of work for the district. Specifically this involves Step Up, the youth synod, and the μ YPS scheme.

Farewell from Philip Turner

'My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing.' Thomas Merton

I love the honesty and humility of that prayer. Despite being seen by some as a spiritual giant, Merton doubts how much he ever gets things right yet still retains hope for being able to show desire for God.

I stand with Merton. I've not always been certain I'm on the right track and I know I've not ministered in the way everyone has found enabling. I've sought to find a path that is right spiritually rather than institutionally; I've put most effort into enabling worship, believing that when we face God together we are most able sense God's heart for the world. And I've felt most alive when I've been able to help others - sometimes accompany others - along the unknown road.

For the last 17 years my family have followed me as the Methodist Church has stationed me in different places and I remain a Methodist Minister willing to serve. Yet sensing increasing clarity in the vocation of my wife, Karen, we wanted to give room for walking through doors that might be opening at this point in her life. On making the decision to withdraw from the re-invitation process, Karen applied for a role, was interviewed and then appointed by the North East Somerset and Bath Circuit to the full time salaried role of chaplain to students for Bath's two universities.

The Methodist Church has formally given me permission to curtail my appointment in the York Circuit and be without appointment for a time in order that as a family we can be together as Karen begins her new role on 3 January 2017. It has all happened much sooner than we would have cho-

sen. We may have got it totally wrong but we feel that this is an opportunity for us to step out in faith and express our desire to please God. I am in the stationing process and, by the time you read this, I will have



found out any match for for a new phase of ministry beginning on 1 September 2017.

My appointment in York has not been easy and because of that I feel that my roots in faith and in friendship have grown particularly deep. Thank you for sharing in my journey and thank you for letting me share in yours. We can't know what lies ahead but we can let our desire to please God guide our steps.

Methodist relief and development

In celebration of Melbourne Terrace

The final celebratory service of Melbourne Terrace Methodist Church more than lived up to its billing – it was a celebration indeed!

Around 150 members of the congregation, friends, visitors and former members, some from as far as South Africa, gathered to celebrate all that had been achieved in the 160 years since the Church was founded. We were brilliantly led by our former minister, Rev Keith Himsworth and with the former member Stuart Ralston playing the organ, the congregation enjoyed this magnificent instrument for a final time.

The service was timed to celebrate 30 years since the Church has been in its new building. A Christian community had existed on the site under the auspices of the Methodist New Connexion from the 1850s, with it being sold to the Wesleyan Methodists in 1872. In 1877, a huge new centre for Wesleyan Methodism was opened and for many years, Melbourne Terrace was a significant force within Methodism in York with work amongst young people being a particular focus. However, by the 1980s, the building was too costly to run, so it was replaced by our beautiful new smaller chapel.

Following the service, everyone stayed for refreshments, for a chance to catch up on old friendships and to look to the future. The building, which is a fine well-placed facility in an excellent state of repair, will initially be used for one year by the Vineyard Church whilst the Circuit considers its future. Members themselves are scattering to Churches throughout the Circuit, so please do look out for us and say hello!



Our final notice sheet said, "We go out into the world to love and praise the Lord". We celebrate all that is past, and look to the future for all that God can continue to do through us.

At Christmas, the congregation of St George's Methodist Church are holding their final service. Many of them will transfer their membership to Heworth.

We are at the stage of seeking dreams and visions through which God's plans might unfold.

An initial meeting will be held at **St George's on Saturday 3rd December** at **10am** to explore this vision further.

Mission Shaped Ministry Course

One of my few disappointments in moving from Hull to York four years ago, was that Hull circuit began to run the Mission Shaped Ministry course, as I left. They had a vision to nurture and develop a small group of people who had a thirst to discover how to share the good news of Jesus in a culture that has changed around us.

The course, which has been run successfully in several places around the country, enabled those people to develop practical skills, and under-standing, while being encouraged to experiment in their local context. It has had amazing results.

I was, therefore, thrilled to hear that, in partnership with the Diocese of York, the course is being offered to our circuit, starting March 2017. The course meets roughly monthly, with 4 Saturdays, 4 Tuesday evenings, and 1 residential weekend in May, finishing in December 2017. Funding is being offered by our district for the costs.

What would be even more fantastic is if we could gather those undertaking the course, between times, and work together on those practical experiments, such that we could bless our circuit, and one another as we learnt.

Joint Public Issues Team

For many years our District had a shared stake in a Joint Anglican and Methodist Social Responsibility Council, in partnership with the Diocese of York, and with observers from The Roman Catholic Diocese of Middlesbrough.

Late last year that initiative came to an end, and since then we have been working across the 4 Yorkshire Districts to think, dream, pray and plan towards a regional expression of JPIT, the Joint Public Issues Team.

JPIT is a UK-wide partnership between our own church, the Church of Scotland, the Baptist Union and United Reformed Church.

Together at national level we fund full-time staff, and they, at times in partnership with others, gather resources to help our leadership speak on our behalf about important issues of our time and also, perhaps more importantly, give us the tools to do so locally. The national JPIT website has sections on the environment, peacemaking, politics and the elections, social justice, social issues and international affairs. It's worth a browse!

In our region all of those broad themes resonate, but with variations unique to our own communities, our dominant political voices, and historical landscape of industry and agriculture.

In March next year our regional JPIT group will be launched, but it will not be just another committee. The vision is to have a small management group commissioning and encouraging ecumenical focus groups around particular issues, producing work that resources the whole church to speak more clearly and effectively into the lives of our local villages, towns and cities.

Methodism began its life as a social movement, giving people a voice, a new kind of partnership in a better common life, and an often uncomfortable accountability for their shared living. In some ways we're going backwards to go forwards, and we have some great friends along for the journey.

Circuit council report 19th September

- New staff: Angie Creswick (Circuit Resource Manager) and Victoria Etherington (Youth Ministry Leader) have been appointed.
- Melbourne Terrace– Vineyard Church will be using the building for the next 12 months and paying rent to the circuit.
- Extensions to stay in the circuit were agreed for Rev Elizabeth Cushion (2 years) and Andy Lindley (5 years), starting September 2017.
- Other staffing changes: Julia Skitt will be taking pastoral responsibility for Stillingfleet, as well as her current churches. Ian Hill will be moving to take pastoral charge of Poppleton, Lidgett, Rufforth and Hessay. Andy Lindley will take on Southlands. Rory Dalgliesh will take a role at Central alongside a deacon.
- St George's have voted to cease worship, with the congregation mostly moving to Heworth. It is hoped a new church council can be drawn together from around the circuit to allow a new work and mission to start there.
- It was agreed that Christine Stephenson, the retiring circuit steward, would be reappointed as part of the circuit steward team for one year, to offer advice and assist.
- A new manse has been purchased in Easingwold to replace Teasdale House, which is in the process of being sold. A new manse is being sought in Acomb to replace the Lindleys' current manse, which does not meet the required standard for manses.
