# Millfield Ln, Nether Poppleton, York, YO26 6PA


Manor Academy can be easily reached from the A1237.

Turn off the roundabout by York Business Park and head down Millfield Lane over the level crossing. Manor school is on your right.

There is a car park at the front of the school.

Disabled parking is available near the main door for blue badge holders.

Please note that you cannot reach Manor school by Millfield Lane from the Boroughbridge Road (A59) end—the road does not go all the way through.

There is a bus stop opposite the school which is served by the 10 and 10A bus.
