
Circuit Children & Families Workers


We thought it would be good to celebrate this and consider how churches can help those who are not so fortunate.

Thornton le Clay

On Sunday 19th May Revd Leslie Newton officially opened the newly completed accessible toilet at Thornton-le-Clay.

The toilet has already meant the local school can visit the church more often and there are hopes it can be further used by the local community.

Leslie spoke about the passage below, showing that sanitation has been a concern for people of faith for much longer than we might think!



Deuteronomy 23:12-14

¹² Designate a place outside the camp where you can go to relieve yourself. ¹³ As part of your equipment have something to dig with, and when you relieve yourself, dig a hole and cover up your excrement. ¹⁴ For the LORD your God moves about in your camp to protect you and to deliver your enemies to you. Your camp must be holy, so that he will not see among you anything indecent and turn away from you.

Epworth Old Rectory

The childhood home of John and Charles Wesley at Epworth in Lincolnshire has also recently upgraded its' visitor toilet facilities and shop.



It's also the 350th anniversary of the birth of Wesley's mother, Susanna, and the story of her influence on her children is a fascinating insight into the role of women at this time.

Cornerstone

The existing toilet facilities at Cornerstone (formerly St George's) were quite old and difficult to keep clean. Since the building is now in use most days of the week by the local community we decided to improve these facilities to help our local community feel cared for, because we care about their experience of the building. One of the old toilets has now been renovated and made into a clean and fresh unisex space, alongside the existing accessible toilet.



Toilet Twinning

Several churches in our Circuit have twinned their toilets with a toilet elsewhere in the world. This provides money to help people in other countries learn about and build a toilet at home, or in schools and communities.

As well as the health benefits of a toilet, there are other reasons having a toilet is transformative. In some parts of the world, it is common for people who

don't have toilets at home to have to go to a field to relieve themselves. Women and girls often are expected to wait until dusk so they aren't seen, which exposes them to the risk of attack by men or animals. Providing toilets at home helps keep people safe, and providing school toilets can help ensure girls don't miss school during their periods.

Rural Mission Enabler

Over the past two years, some of the churches in the north end of the circuit have experienced working with a Rural Mission Enabler. David Arscott joined the circuit in September 2017 and has worked with the churches of Easingwold, Alne, Husthwaite, Huby, Tholthorpe, Stillington, Sheriff Hutton and Thornton le Clay. During this time he has walked with them, reflecting on Biblical models of mission and exploring what mission looks like for each church and person today. As David put it, it was not about telling churches what to do but helping them think about what God is calling them to be and enabling them to do mission in their community. For some it was identifying new possibilities; for others, beginning a new community project with a vision beyond the original idea; for others it was 'mission accomplished' with a project completed or seeking how to be church outside a building.

Now David's role here is mission accomplished as he leaves this circuit. We thank David for all he has done and wish him every blessing in the next part of his mission.

Circuit Council Report 30th April 2019 and 19th June 2019

- The meeting sent prayers and best wishes to Mo Onyett as she is recommended to Conference to begin 3 year part time training for presbyteral ministry this September. The meeting noted that Deacon Judith Stoddart is to be ordained at Conference on 30th June, as are Deacon Corinne Brown and Revd Paul Parker who were both sent out from this Circuit in recent years.
- Lorraine Jones reported on her work as Chaplain at Forest of Galtres Anglican Methodist Primary School, included leading collective worship, running lunch clubs and prayer spaces, helping with work on the school's Vision and Ethos ahead of inspections and generally being available for people to talk to.
- Lorraine Jones and Heather Lewis were welcomed as new part time Circuit Children and Families Workers, to work alongside Amy Shephard (Circuit Youth Worker) and Victoria Etherington (Circuit Youth Ministry Leader). There will be an evening for volunteers working with children and youth planned for Wednesday 10th July 7-9pm with food from 6.30pm at Haxby & Wigginton. Please contact Amy Shephard to book. Please encourage people to attend.
- A process of Pastoral Review is going on in all our churches, with members encouraged to complete Questionnaires which will then feed in to meetings between church leadership, ministers and circuit stewards, to determine the strengths and weaknesses, hopes and fears of all our churches. Results will hopefully be available by September.
- The meeting gave permission to let the Headley Close manse to a family of refugees through the City of York Council.
- The Annual Accounts for 2017-18 and Budget for 2019-20 were presented and accepted. There will be some changes to ministerial staffing with Revd Julia Skitt leaving and Revds Steve Barlow and Ruth Duck joining the Circuit staff part time.
- The meeting was notified that Ian Cartwright, formerly a deacon in this Circuit, has resigned from his role as a deacon and from membership in the Methodist Church, and will therefore no longer be listed on the Circuit Plan.
- Mandy Brewer was appointed as Circuit Council Secretary.
- The Circuit Stewards from September 2019 were appointed: John Middleton and Janet Bowling will be senior stewards, with Joyce Jinks, Ruth Morri-

- son, Rosemary Freeborn and Sue Gill as circuit stewards and Nick Dawson joining Peter Metcalf as Finance steward.
- The Circuit Stewards reported that with regret the decision had been taken to make the role of Rural Mission Enabler redundant, and that David Arscott would be leaving at the end of August 2019.
- It was reported that the members at Husthwaite had taken the difficult decision to close the chapel building, although they hope to continue meeting in the village.
- The representatives from our Circuit to District Synod were appointed: Janet Bowling, John Middleton, Peter Metcalf, Rosamond Carter, Tim Duffy, Rosemary Freeborn, Sue Gill, Elizabeth Griffiths, Robin Jackson, Malcolm Parker, Ruth Watson.
- The meeting approved proceeding with the work to convert Melbourne Terrace into a Circuit Hub, including office space and hireable meeting space.
- The meeting was notified of plans to hold an event to encourage support for All We Can on Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd November.
