York Methodist Circuit - 'Own Arrangements' - Digital Options

Don't panic ! Here are some digital options to consider and potential sources of online services as well as advice on how to download videos for watching without Internet connection.

- Pre-recorded services: services specifically put together in advance for online viewing
- Livestream: services which are broadcast 'live' and usually recorded for later viewing

With Internet connection, laptop and sound/projection/TV				
Scenario 1 – watch (cinema style)	Scenario 2 – mix			

- Find the circuit livestream/service for that week from <u>the plan</u>. Load up <u>YouTube</u> and watch together (live or delay)
- Connect to another churches local Zoom service as participant and watch together
- Watch a pre-recorded service or 'back catalogue' item (see below for sources)
- Arrange local leading of hymns and prayers
- Use the circuit livestream for the readings and/or sermon. Rewind or wait a little if needed.
- Use pre-recorded sermon or back catalogue

Scenario 2: If planning to take (part) of a livestream, where feasible, it may be worth coordinating material/timings in advance with the preacher.

Without Internet Connection but laptop and sound/projection/TV

Download a prerecord or previous livestream in advance (see below for how to do this).
Play and watch in whole or in part.



Downloading a YouTube video for watching later

1. Download and install the application <u>WinX YouTUbe downloader</u> or similar.

2.Copy the URL from Youtube . Click 'Add URL' in WinX and paste YouTube URL in place of default entry. Click Analyze.



3. Once analyzed, a range of download options at different resolutions are offered. Default is usually OK. Select 'Download selected videos'

4. You can change the download location by selecting 'Output Folder>Browse'. Ensure a folder available offline is selected. The output format can be changed using the 'Select output format'. (default is mp4) but these are only video formats. A separate program (e.g VLC media player) will be needed to extract just audio from the video file e.g mp3. WinX may try to offer 'VideoProc' as a solution but this is not free (except as trial) and is not required unless you need more functionality.
